STUDENT \$35.00



HISTORY AND PURPOSE

The Western Massachusetts Paralegal Association (WMPA) is a voluntary, nonprofit association formed in 1988 to promote the professional development and continuing education of paralegals in the Western Massachusetts area. The goals of the WMPA are:

This person may be retained or employed by a lawyer, law office, governmental agency, corporation, or other entity.

NFPA was founded in 1974 and currently represents thousands of paralegals.
